The Luton class has always, like many other classes in the UK, had a strong tradition of mission, often with a heart for a particular group of people. This is Merna's story.....

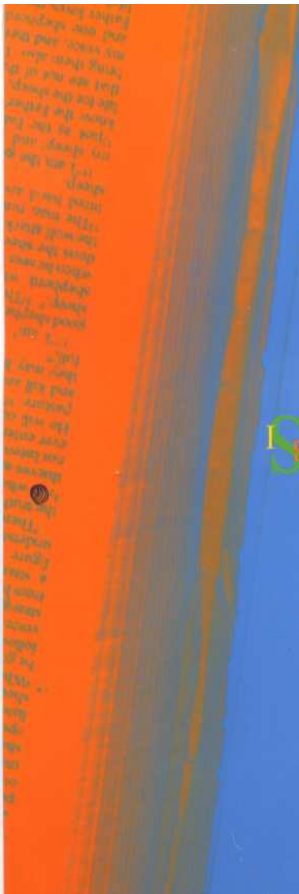
**Merna** and her husband have had a heart to work with Muslims since their conversion. Born in the Middle East, they both speak Arabic as their mother tongue. They have three lovely boys. For many years, they lived in London ministering to Arab Muslims. Recently, God opened the door for Merna's husband to renew his ministry in the Middle East. He has visited various churches to disciple and to encourage leaders. Now God is calling them to join OC International full time to equip Muslim Background Believers (MBBs) to multiply the Lord's church throughout the Arab world.

Merna writes;

**"We are committed to see churches planted for and by Muslim-background believers. In order to achieve this, we need to be working full-time, and alongside gifted and experienced team members, with experienced leadership. In addition, the ministry will take on a broader geographical scope, across the Middle East and even Arab North Africa.**

**My husband visited Iraq on different occasion to lead training and encourage the church. I am involved in first-ever training for MBB women who have turned to follow Christ and this ministry is now up and running!**

**In order to be more engaged with the team, we have put our house on the market and are seeking to move this summer. This is a full-time ministry. We will be resigning from our jobs. The initial two years involves mentoring input from our team leader, himself a former Muslim and fund raising. In spite of what we hear in the Middle East of horrible things, the reality is that God is moving and un-**

## DARTMOOR PRISON REPORT

Janet Clifford and Jan Bishop brought a report of their experience in Dartmoor Prison where they have run a CBSI class for the inmates there. When it was closed down last December the team continued to meet weekly to pray for the prison situation and to continue their study programme. It has been a sad time for them with its discouraging moments but they continue to be-

lieve that God will open ways forward for them.

Both Janet and Jan found the conference inspiring and challenging. They said to me that they want to see a CBSI class started in their community of Tavistock in spite of what happens regarding Dartmoor Prison.

The desire is for the Prison chaplain, Bill Burrows, to be well enough to return full-time to the prison and for him to bring the CBSI study back in under his chaplaincy pro-

gramme.

PLEASE pray to this end and pray that the team keeps their eyes on Jesus through this time.

Jan, from a Welsh background, is so excited about CBSI that after meeting the Caleb team for Wales at the conference, she has joined Janet Morgan Phillips on some of her time in Wales this May.

### URGENT NEWS

Jill Cullen has an urgent prayer request from Frinton. She writes;

"Josephah Ugrashebuja is a member of the Frinton CBSI group whose husband, Celestin, was arrested on 28th December 2006 on alleged charges of genocide in Rwanda. They had fled Rwanda in 1994 during the troubles between the Hutu and Tutsi tribes. He is now being held at Belmarsh High Security Prison in London. He came to the UK as an asylum seeker eight years ago and was joined by Josephah a year later.

The Rector of Frinton Parish

Church, where they worship, as well as a retired missionary from Rwanda and others who have worked closely with them during this time are convinced of his innocence.

Members of all the Frinton churches have supported them practically and prayerfully over the last eight years. Three prayer vigils have been held since his arrest for Celestin's release and for justice to be done for him.

While in prison Celestin has been a strong witness to his faith and letters from him to the church family have been an inspiration.

Please pray for;

1) Justice to be done.

2) For the future hearings in May, June and September.

3) Against his extradition.

4) For members of their family in prison in Rwanda because they refuse to give false testimony against him.

Josephah is now treated as a single person. She has had to pack up their home and move into temporary accommodation with two moves already behind her. In spite of their ordeal, their faith has not wavered."
