UK Spanish Speaking Classes

When Hector Antelo heard that his friend, Margaret Edmunds, formerly a Missionary in Peru and Bolivia, was running a Bible Study Class, he wanted to know more. Hector's passion has always been to see God's Word working in people's lives. When he heard that the courses were also available in Spanish, he wondered whether God was leading him to start his own class for Spanish speakers. That was a few months ago and now Hector is leading the first Spanish speaking CBSI class in the UK. His friend David Titiboco, hearing about this, also attended training with Hector and has started a Spanish speaking class in Peckham, South London.

Although Hector and David came from the same village in Bolivia, they didn't meet until a mutual friend introduced them in 2006 in the UK. Since then they have become firm friends, encouraging each other in their Ministries.

Having trained as a Pastor in Bolivia, Hector

went back to his own village after theological college. Here he saw many local people trusting Jesus for the first time and saw others grow in their faith. He met and married Helen, who had gone out to Bolivia as part of a Latin Link 'STEP team'. After marrying in the UK, they served for 5 years in Bolivia, first in a shantytown in Santa Cruz and then in a rural town. Hector and Helen have returned to the UK, where they have been living for the last 5 years with their four small children. They are praying for God's guidance in their lives and Ministry.

Since Hector's faithful steps in starting the Spanish class, we have had other interest in Spanish classes here. The UK and Peru were the first classes to start outside the US thirty years ago. Most of the studies we have available to us are also available in Spanish. Please pray with us that God will continue to open the door for Spanish Speakers in the UK.

Many of our CBSI UK family will have met Val over the years of her association with the CBSI ministry. She looked forward to, and regularly attended the annual conference for leaders where she enjoyed meeting people and hearing of the growth of Community Bible Study, both internationally and within the UK.

Val joined the local CBSI UK class in Leicester a couple of years after its inception 16 years ago and was pivotal in establishing the class. Her enthusiasm for the Word of God and her willingness to share her deeper knowledge was quickly recognised and she served as the assistant class leader to Canon John Tonkin, eventually replacing him as class leader in 2001.

For a short while Val served on the National Servants Team, where she brought her own inimitable style. She was always keen to promote Bible study, and found an ideal forum for this in CBSI UK. She relished the challenge of studying the less well-known books. One of the last comments she made to one of our members who visited Val in the care home was: "well, you'll be fine with

Isaiah - what are you going to do for a challenge next year?"!!

Always a faithful member of the class, it was very rare for Val to miss a meeting. She eagerly anticipated any social gatherings that were held, and could always be relied on to bring a quiche to any 'bring and share' meal!

Over the last two years we have seen her health deteriorate, but not her desire to meet with the CBSI class in Leicester. Indeed, there were many weeks earlier this year where it was evident that it took a great deal of determination to attend, and the effort to participate was great.

Val leaves a legacy of biblical teaching that will continue to bear fruit. We are grateful to God for her service within the Leicester class, and give thanks to Him that she is now free of her pain and able to see Him face to face.

In recognition and appreciation of Val's life and work, the CBSI classes in Leicester Braunstone and Birstall gave a donation to Project Malawi to purchase Bibles for women who have recently learned to read.

'I am the light of the world'

Having disposed of our Christmas trees some time ago, this may seem a strange picture to have in the New Year Newsletter but read on! Rachel Smith, our National Administrator, heard about a Christmas Tree festival in her village and felt that it was a wonderful opportunity to have a Christian presence and speak about God's gift of His son and all that His birth meant to the world. At the same time it seemed a wonderful opportunity to inform about CBSI in the community.

Rachel put texts on the silver balls with reference to light:

"The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world..."

"The light that shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not put it out..."

The paper chain has words representing darkness, war, slavery, people trafficking, debt etc. An open Bible with a candle was placed next to it and invitations to join the local CBSI class. Of the 46 trees represented this was the only tree mentioning the true meaning of Christmas. Since Rachel has moved to Barton, she has made it her business to be a light in her community, knocking on doors, introducing herself. Rachel has started a CBS class in her home in the heart of her community, where there is always an open door to neighbours and friends.





The Leith Class

Led by Elyse Sayle, the Leith class is a diverse and vibrant class, caring and working in the heart of the community. Elyse and her team care for each member and love to see the people in their group growing in their knowledge of God. Each member helps the next and this makes for a wonderful atmosphere in which individuals are valued and understand God's love for them.

One valued member is Aman who comes to

the group with his carer. His mother, who was a missionary, adopted Aman in Hong Kong. His total dedication to finishing his study every week is such a witness and encouragement to those around him. Aman is virtually mute and also has some visual impairment. He communicates through a voice synthesiser, which he activates via a keyboard. This way he can share in discussion. Can you imagine the patience and dedication that he has to complete his home study questions and the joy it must be for him and others as he shares what God has been saying to him?

This class has also started the first Teen Class. In faith, Russell Simpson and Louise Whatnough have started the class with just two members, but we know it will grow as they start to invite their friends. The teenagers are really good at coming prepared and answering their questions. Discussion is great as they often come with questions of their own. One member is a brand new believer, so it is the first time he is hearing some of the stories in Genesis and certainly his first time studying the Bible. He has a fresh perspective on many things, which enliven discussion.
